

# Penetrating Spa Cleanser

## Application Directions

*This 5-10 day process is designed to clean away contaminants already present deep within spa plumbing, fittings and equipment.*

### Penetrating Spa Cleanser Application Directions

- Remove the spa filter cartridge from the filter housing and store in a safe place during the cleaning process. It is recommended that the filter be cleaned with the Filter Soak or replaced if one year or older. See Filter cleaning tips for details.
- If using the existing spa water containing bromine or chlorine or your spa is five or more years old, pour in two 16-ounce bottles of the Penetrating Spa Cleanser into the water. If the spa is less than five years old OR you are starting with new water not containing any bromine or chlorine, pour one 16-ounce bottle of Penetrating Spa Cleanser into the water.
- Circulate the spa water at a temperature of 90 degrees for a minimum of 8 hours per day for seven days. If Bromine has been used in the spa water, circulate the spa water for at least 10 days.
- After seven to ten days, drain the water, and flush the spa with fresh water. Fill the tub up to the foot well area, clean the inside of the spa with baking soda or Penetrating Spa Cleanser for cleaning the spa tub and Penetrating Filter Soak for cleaning the spa filters. Do not use chemical filter cleaners or any household cleaners that have chemicals in them when you put water back in your spa, because the chemicals may react with the water and cause an odor or cloud the water in tub. Now wash down the inside with clean water and drain. This will aid in completely flushing contaminants from your spa.
- Now, completely refill your spa with fresh water to the desired level, we highly recommend using a Carbon Block Pre-filter and then move on to cleaning your cover and step two.
- Clean both sides of the spa cover with soap and water. If the cover is cracked or torn, we recommend it be replaced. VERY IMPORTANT: If your spa cover has a zipper closure it is important to unzip the cover BUT DO NOT REMOVE THE COVER because it is difficult to put back on. Flush the inside of the cover with your garden hose. The inside of spa covers have been known to harbor mold and bacteria, all of which drip from condensation through the cover back into the spa water.
- We strongly suggest that the spa not be used during the contaminant cleaning process.
